

Fine Motor Developmental Checklist Please check yes or no for each of the following:

YES	Birth – 3 Months: Hands are in a fist and thumbs are tucked in Brings fingers to mouth to suck Swings at a target using entire arm Holds objects in hands Mostly random & spontaneous movements Follows a moving person with their eyes	Tes No 12 – 18 Months: Builds a tower of 2 or more cubes Marks with pencil/crayons Scribbles spontaneously Can hold on object with 1 hand & manipulate it with the other hand
	3 - 6 Months: Picks up objects with one hand Transfers objects from one hand to another Brings feet to mouth Holds hands together Actively holds toy Looks at objects a few feet away Makes gurgling sounds when left alone or playing with you	18 – 24 Months: Imitates vertical & circular scribbles Threads beads on a string Turns pages of book 2-3 pages at a time Holds crayons between thumb and fingers Unscrews a lid on a container Inserts shapes into shape sorter Stacks 7 blocks
	6 – 9 Months: Rakes small objects with whole hand Uses thumb & fingertips to grabs cheerio Uses thumb & side of index finger to grip object Holds 2 objects, one in each hand Removes a cube from a cup Uses both hands to pick up large object	3 – 4 Years: Draws or copies a complete circle Stacks 9 - 10 blocks Cuts with scissors Turns pages of a book 1 at a time Imitates a 3-block bridge Completes 2 – 4 piece puzzle
	9 – 12 Months: Uses pincer grasp Puts small objects in cup or other container Holds crayon in fist, scribbles Turns book pages a few at a time Attempts to imitate new gestrues Attempts to stack 2 blocks Releases ball with a controlled release Uses both hands & begins to show a preference fo one hand	4 -5 Years: Draws recognizable shapes and pictures Prints four letters of first name Draws a person that has at least 3 parts (head, eyes nose, etc.)
